



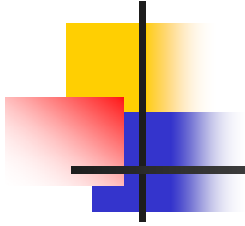

Adequate Yearly Progress

- **When a school does not make AYP for two consecutive years or more**
- **Identified for school improvement and is a high priority school.**



- **Test 95% of students enrolled in tested grade level as a whole school and for each required subgroup.**



The School **MUST** Meet or Exceed Attendance Rate

2004 – 2005 (80% or Higher)

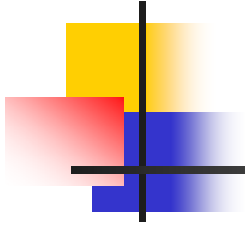
2005 – 2006 (85% or Higher)

2008 – 2009 (90% This rate will remain in effect through 2013 – 2014.)

- Phase 6 – Continue Implementation of Restructuring Plan



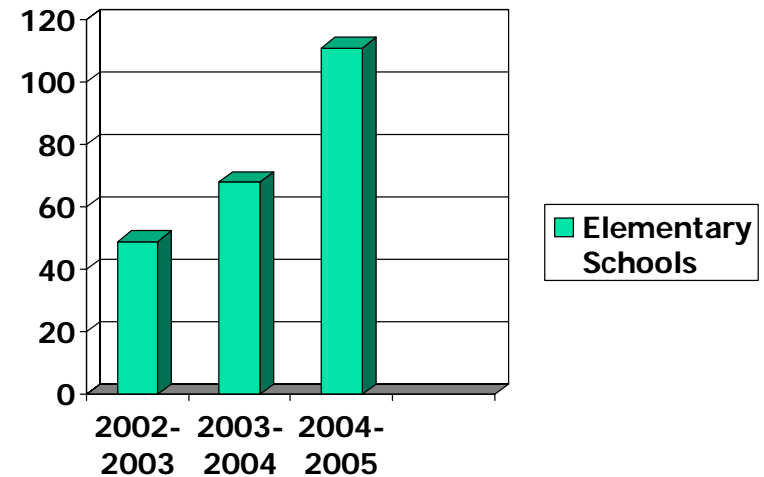

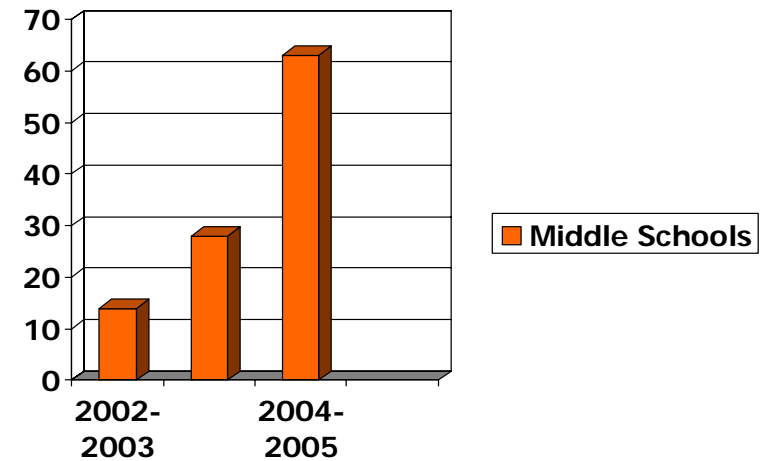

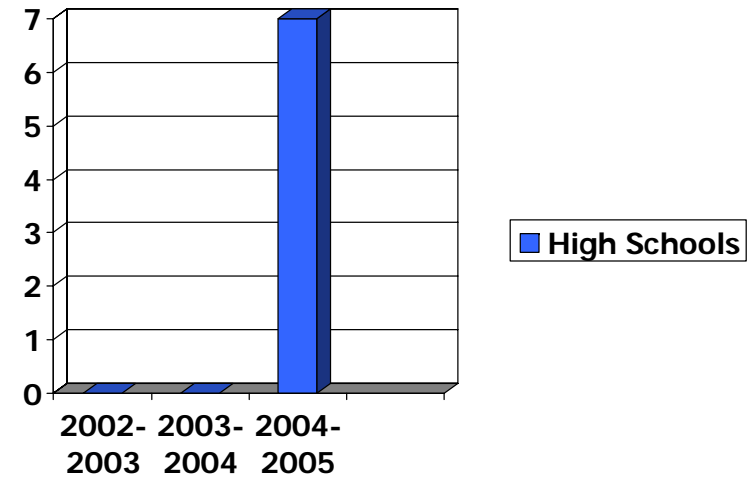

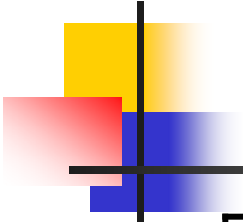

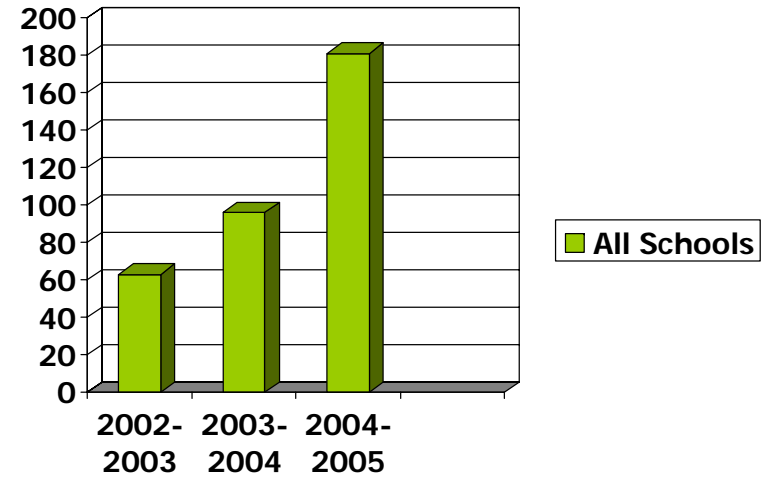

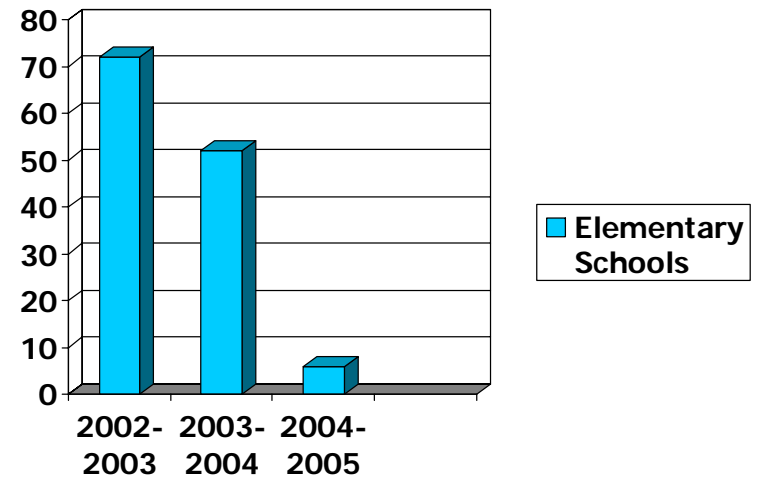

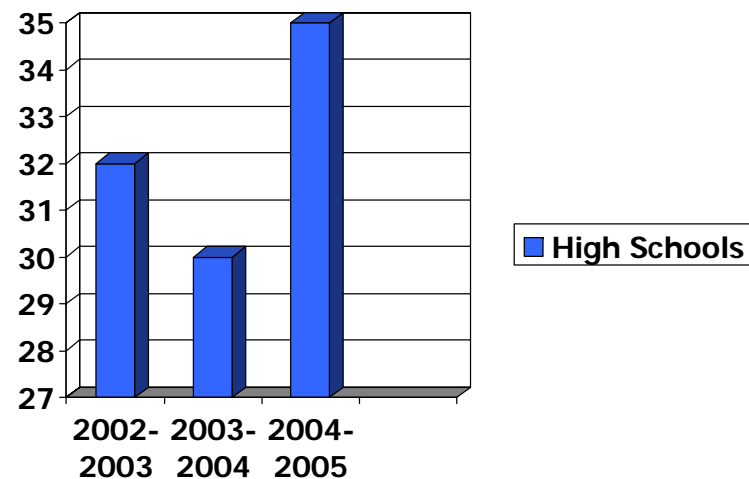
