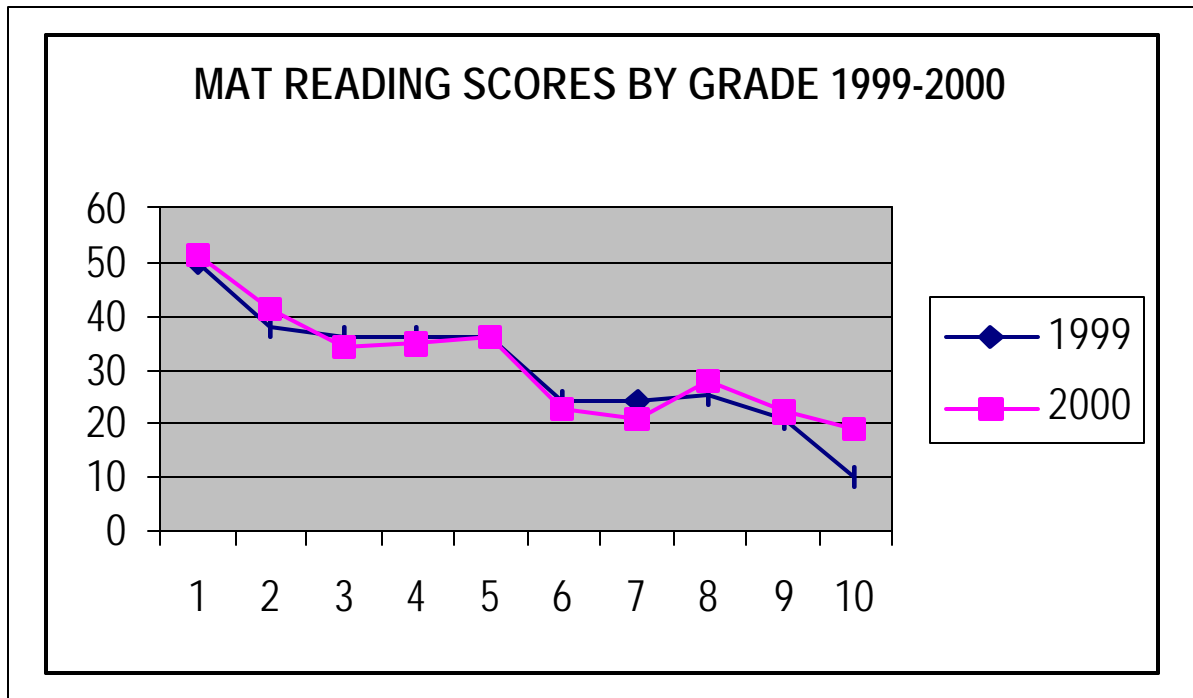

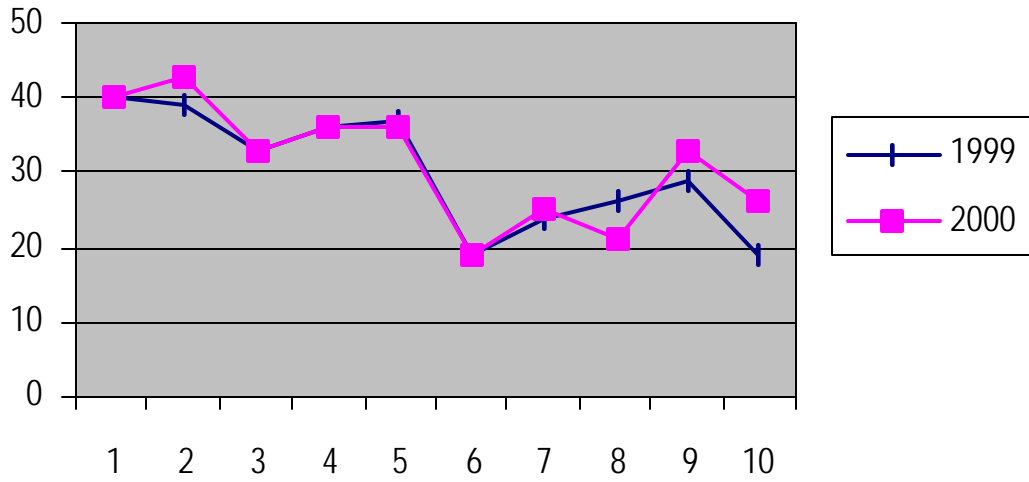

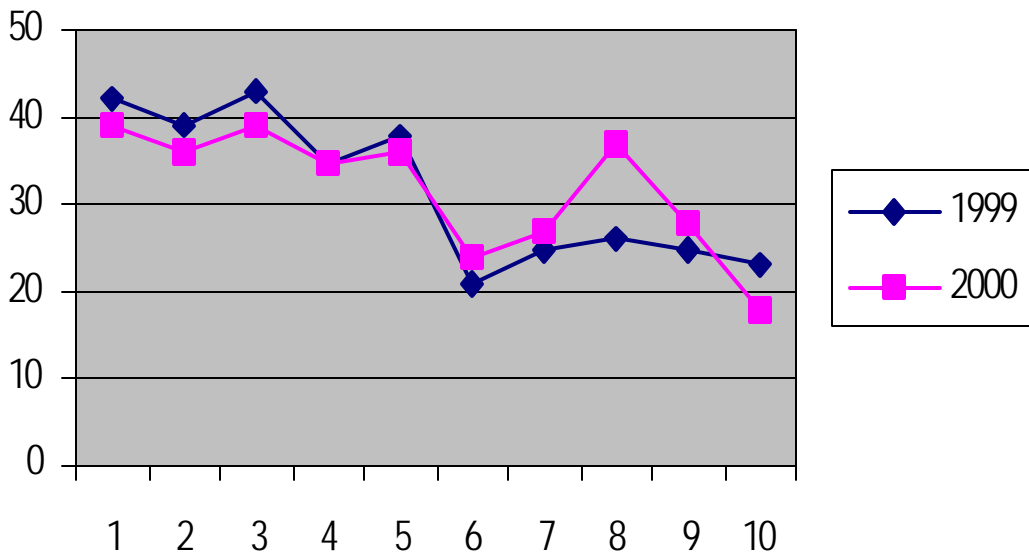
Metropolitan Achievement Test Scores 1999-2000

### MAT SCIENCE SCORES 1999-2000

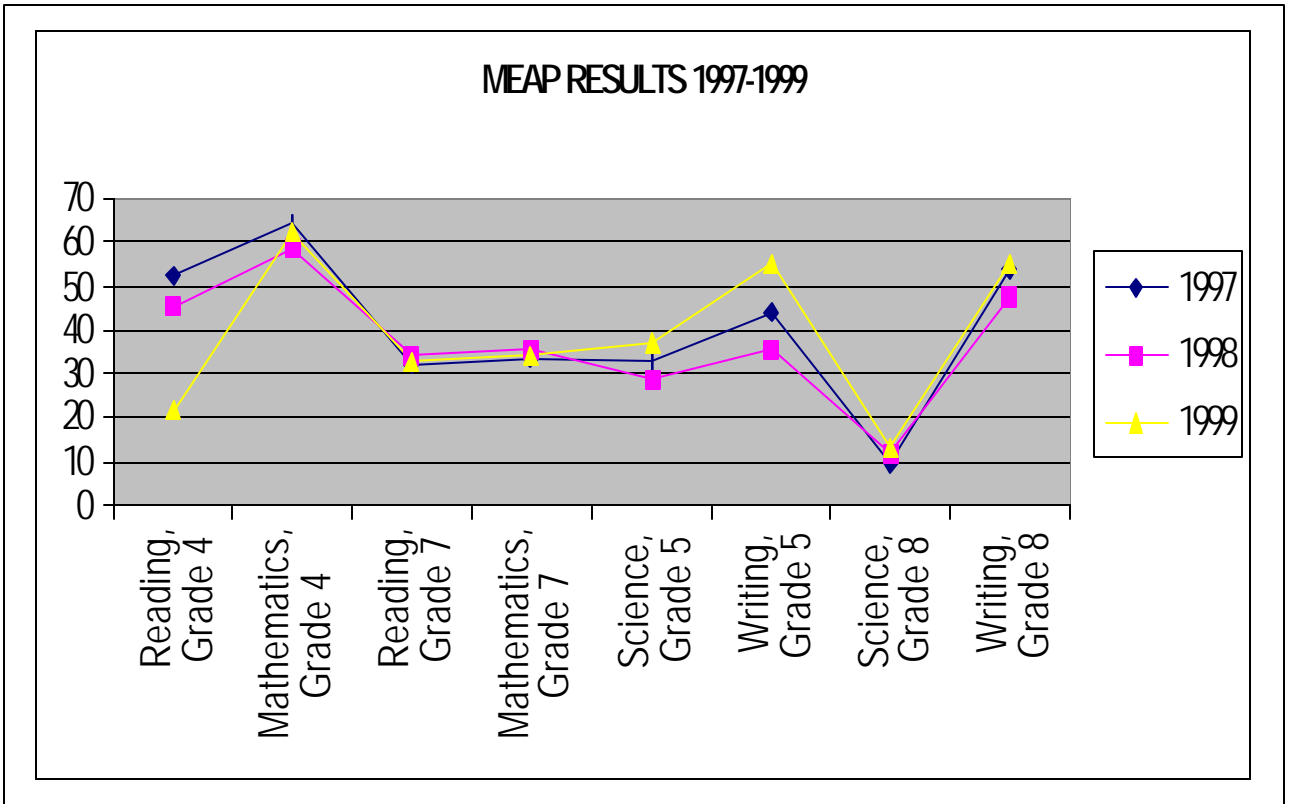
