

STELA Project

ATTIC is a member of the Michigan Region IV Assistive Technology Consortium, which includes representatives from eight Intermediate School Districts in Southeast Michigan. The purpose of Region IV is to collaborate on assistive technology issues in compliance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act regulations.



The STELA Project was developed at the Region IV Consortium to explore ways in which assistive technology could help students with mild disabilities succeed within the general education curriculum.

STELA stands for Strategies and Tools to Enhance Learning for All and its goals are the following:

- To provide classroom teachers with a sampling of instructional strategies, assistive technology tools, and training to support all learners, including those considered at risk, in reading and writing across the curriculum.**
- To develop a systematic approach to provide general education classroom teachers with assistive technology tools, training and support that is easily replicable.**

The expected outcomes for the STELA Project are:

- Increased participation for students with mild disabilities in the general education classroom, as well as for students considered at risk, with emphasis in reading and writing across the curriculum.**
- Improved student achievement in the state benchmarks for Language Arts.**
- Increased teacher awareness and use of technology.**
