Example: Jenifer has 9 cupcakes. She made 2 more cupcakes. But her sister took 3 cupcakes. How many cupcakes does she have left?

Step 1 : Jenifer had 9 cupcakes. She made 2 cupcakes for her sister that would mean that the total is 11. Step 2: Her sister took 3 cupcakes Step 3: It can be written as 11-3 as expression Draw a number line and locate 11, then move left for 3 numbers since there is a subtraction sign between 11 and 3.

-12 -11 -10 -9 -8 -7 -6 -5 -4 -3 -2 -1 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12

So Jenifer has 8 cupcakes.
