

PARENTS

DID YOU KNOW?

Too many absences — excused or unexcused—can keep students from succeeding in school and in life. How many are too many? 10% of the school year—that's 18 missed days or 2 days a month—can knock students off track.

- 1 Attend School Everyday
- 2 Create a Family Routine
- Participate in Parent Teacher Conferences and workshops

Children who were chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are far less likely to read proficiently at the end of 3rd grade.

Attendance improves when schools engage students and parents in positive ways and when schools provide mentors for chronically absent students.



COVID-19 SCREENING TOOL FOR FAMILIES

Parents and guardians, use this checklist every day before sending your children to school.

If you answer "YES" to one or more questions, you must keep your child home from school today.

Does your child have any unusual symptoms from the list below?

YES NO

A fever? (Temperature greater than 100.4 ° F)

A new or worsening cough?

Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing?

Runny nose and/or congestion?

Body aches and/or tiredness?

Vomiting and/or diarrhea?

New loss of smell or taste?

If the answer to any of the questions above is "yes" keep your child home and consult your primary care physician. If a doctor determines that the symptoms are due to another diagnosis, or COVID-19 is ruled out, your child may return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

	Have you or your child had close contact with anyone who had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic test in the past 14 days?		
	Have you ar your shild your traveled out of the US in the last 14 days?		

If the answer is "yes" to either of these questions, you and your child must stay home to quarantine for 14 days since last contact or return to US.

FREE COVID-19 TESTING FOR DPSCD STUDENTS

All DPSCD staff and students are required to participate in weekly, salivabased PCR testing for in person learning. One-time parental consent registration is required before January 31, 2022, otherwise students will be enrolled at the DPSCD Virtual School. Results are sent by test or email in 1-2 days.



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PARENTING IS EXPENSIVE.

THE CHILD TAX CREDIT GIVES YOUR FAMILY A RAISE!



Do you have children under 18 in your home? You should have received the **first half** of your child tax credit in monthly cash payments between July and December 2021. To receive the **second half** of your credit, file taxes in 2022!

Didn't receive your monthly payments? It's not too late to claim your Child Tax Credit! You may be eligible even if you are not the child's biological parent or if you do not usually file taxes or have low/no earnings.

Now more than ever, it pays to file your taxes. Changes to tax law mean that you may be leaving money on the table if you don't file.

HOW MUCH WILL MY FAMILY GET FROM THE CHILD TAX CREDIT?

Children under age 6: Up to \$3,600 per child **Children ages 6 to 17:** Up to \$3,000 per child

First half paid in monthly payments, July - Dec 2021

Get the second half — a one-time payment — after filing taxes in 2022.

DON'T HAVE KIDS?

You may still be eligible for other tax credits and COVID-19 relief payments! File your taxes so you don't miss out.

MENTAL HEALTH GUIDE

TIPS AND TOOLS FOR SELF-CARE

There is not a one-size fits all answer to self-care. When choosing strategies make sure you utilize practices that are personally relevant and helpful to you and your family. Here are some strategies to consider:

- Recognize and validate emotions
- Stay in the present
- Separate out what you can and cannot control
- Notice and manage your worried thoughts
- Pay attention to joy
- Balance structure and exibility
- Get active
- Stay connected

TIPS AND TOOLS FOR TALKING TO YOUR CHILD

Talking about mental health – Open ended questions:

- How are you feeling? Can you tell me more about what's on your mind?
- How can I help you feel better?
 Ya know, sometimes you need to
 talk to an adult about your feelings
 I'm here to listen.
- Have you had feelings like this in the past?
- Do you feel like you want to talk to someone else about your problem?
- I'm worried about your safety. Can you tell me if you have thoughts about harming yourself or others?

TIPS FOR APPROACHING THE CONVERSATION

- Communicate in a straightforward manner
- Speak at a level that is appropriate for your child's age level
- Discuss the topic when you are in a calm environment and your child feels comfortable and safe
- Watch for reactions during the discussion and slow down or back up if your child becomes confused or looks upset
- Listen openly and let your child tell you about their feelings and worries



GEORGE CRUM

George Crum (born George Speck, 1824–1914) was a renowned African American chef who worked at Moon's Lake House in Saratoga Springs, New York during the mid-1800s. According to culinary legend, Crum invented the potato chip during his work at the restaurant.

HOMESTYLE POTATO CHIPS

SERVINGS: 8 SERVINGS PREP TIME: 40 MINUTES

COOK TIME: 20 MINUTES TOTAL TIME: 1 HOUR

Making homestyle potato chips is fun and easy. Guaranteed they won't last long! A food processor with a slicing attachment is very helpful. Experiment with the thickness; you may like them thicker or thinner. I like to use olive oil because it has less trans fats, but you can use safflower, corn, or peanut oil as well as vegetable oil.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 medium potatoes, peeled and sliced paper-thin
- 3 tablespoons salt
- 1 quart oil for deep frying

Place potato slices into a large bowl of cold water as you slice. Drain, and rinse, then refill the bowl with water, and add the salt. Let the potatoes soak in the salty water for at least 30 minutes. Drain, then rinse and drain again.

STEP 2

Heat oil in a deep-fryer to 365 degrees F (185 degrees C). Fry potato slices in small batches. Once they start turning golden, remove and drain on paper towels. Continue until all of the slices are fried. Season with additional salt if desired.

NEW ORLEANS CREOLE GUMBO

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ¾ cup bacon drippings
- 1 cup coarsely chopped celery
- 1 large onion, coarsely chopped
- 1 large green bell pepper, coarsely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 pound andouille sausage, sliced
- 3 quarts water
- 6 cubes beef bouillon
- 1 tablespoon white sugar
- 2 tablespoons hot pepper sauce (such as Tabasco®), or to taste
- ½ teaspoon Cajun seasoning blend (such as Tony Chachere's®), or to taste

- Salt to taste
 - 4 bay leaves
 - ½ teaspoon dried thyme leaves
 - 1 (14.5 ounce) can stewed tomatoes
 - 1 (6 ounce) can tomato sauce
 - 4 teaspoons file powder, divided
 - 2 tablespoons bacon drippings
 - 2 (10 ounce) packages frozen cut okra, thawed
 - 2 tablespoons distilled white vinegar
 - 1 pound lump crabmeat
 - 3 pounds uncooked medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
 - 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

STEP 1

Make a roux by whisking the flour and 3/4 cup bacon drippings together in a large, heavy saucepan over medium-low heat to form a smooth mixture. Cook the roux, whisking constantly, until it turns a rich mahogany brown color. This can take 20 to 30 minutes; watch heat carefully and whisk constantly or roux will burn. Remove from heat; continue whisking until mixture stops cooking.

STEP 2

Place the celery, onion, green bell pepper, and garlic into the work bowl of a food processor, and pulse until the vegetables are very finely chopped. Stir the vegetables into the roux, and mix in the sausage. Bring the mixture to a simmer over medium-low heat, and cook until vegetables are tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Remove from heat, and set aside.

STEP 3


Bring the water and beef bouillon cubes to a boil in a large Dutch oven or soup pot. Stir until the bouillon cubes dissolve, and whisk the roux mixture into the boiling water. Reduce heat to a simmer, and mix in the sugar, salt, hot pepper sauce, Cajun seasoning, bay leaves, thyme, stewed tomatoes, and tomato sauce. Simmer the soup over low heat for 1 hour; mix in 2 teaspoons of file gumbo powder at the 45-minute mark.

STEP 4

Meanwhile, melt 2 tablespoons of bacon drippings in a skillet, and cook the okra with vinegar over medium heat for 15 minutes; remove okra with slotted spoon, and stir into the simmering gumbo. Mix in crabmeat, shrimp, and Worcestershire sauce, and simmer until flavors have blended, 45 more minutes. Just before serving, stir in 2 more teaspoons of file gumbo powder.
