## Five Tips to Help Your Student Succeed

### STAY POSITIVE

Remind your student to try their best. Stay positive.

### FIND SPACE

Find the best space you can and remove distractions.

### HELP START TESTING

If possible, work with student to get started with their testing session.

### LET STUDENT ANSWER

Mistakes are ok. Let your student answer on their own. Do not read the test for them.



### REMAIN CALM

Work with the teacher to solve problems if they come up.

## I-READY DIAGNOSTICS

**STARTS SEPTEMBER 21**

The i-Ready Diagnostics are given three times a year in reading and math. Students test online at home and will need to hear sound from their device. Parents can help with this test during the login process. This test takes about 60 to 90 minutes for each of the two subject areas.

## DISTRICT BENCHMARKS

**STARTS SEPTEMBER 21**

The District Benchmarks are assessments given three times a year in science and social studies. Students test online at home using Performance Matters and will need to connect to the internet. This test takes about 60 to 90 minutes for each of the two subject areas.

## ACADEMIC APPROACH

**STARTS OCTOBER 5**

The Academic Approach assessment provides students in grade 8 an opportunity to practice for the College Board PSAT. The test measures students' progress toward college readiness in reading/writing and math. Students will use Performance Matters to take this assessment at home. The Academic Approach assessment takes about 3 hours to complete.
