LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

he 2017-18 school year was one that saw the Detroit Public Schools Community District Office of Charter Schools offering more opportunities for professional development, oversight and support to board members. The office focused on its mission to support, develop, and hold charter schools accountable, so that they can prepare Detroit children for future opportunities. The information contained in this annual report represents data from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. It offers a snapshot of the students served, as well as how the school performed on a variety of important measures.

During the 2017-18 year, our office experienced a reorganization that reflects our new focus on support and oversight of our Charter School Board of Directors. According to Ivan J. Lorentzen (2013), "the practices of effective boardsmanship, have a strong correlation with high student achievement." As a result, a new position was added to our team, Deputy Executive Director of Operations and Board Governance. Dikea Riley was selected for this role and is responsible for financial oversight, coordination of logistics, and support for our charter school boards. Our goal was to build capacity in our boards in order to have a positive effect on each of our charter schools.



Our team continues to assess our charter schools by using multiple sources of data and identifying deficiencies that need to be improved. As an Authorizer, we are data driven and have multiple data dashboards for academics, enrollment, financials, compliance and board evaluations. The data dashboards were used on a continuous basis to make adjustments to our policies and provide interventions for our charter school stakeholders.

In order to map our path to success, we must collectively take stock of where we are and how far we have to go. We hope this report will assist in that effort.

We are honored to work with dedicated school board members, principals, teachers and a host of other personnel who impact children daily.
