APPLICATION AND AUDITION PROCESS

All students entering Grades 6 – 8 and applying to a Middle School Arts Conservatory Program or entering Grades 9 – 12 applying to Detroit School of Arts will be required to submit an online application.

DSA requires each student to provide two references:

- 1. An academic recommendation
- 2. An artistic recommendation

Middle School Arts Conservatories require each student to provide one Artistic Reference.

Each school will contact and schedule an audition directly with prospective students. Applicants may audition in person, online or via video conference.

Acceptance to DSA requires each student pass an academic screening.

Upon acceptance, admission to DSA or a Middle School Arts Conservatory will be on a rolling "first-come first-serve basis" until all spaces are filled.
