As Metro Detroit's premier public education arts and music high school, the Detroit School of Arts (DSA) offers students intensive training in Dance, Instrumental Music, Vocal Music, Visual Art, Theatre, Literary Arts, and Multimedia Production within a rigorous college prep curriculum. All applicants are required to audition for admission.

The District has four Middle School Arts Conservatories that provides students a direct pathway to the Detroit School of Arts:

- **Brenda Scott Academy for Theatre Arts**
- **Edward 'Duke' Ellington Conservatory of Music & Art at Beckham Academy**
- **John R. King Academic and Performing Arts Academy**
- **Spain Elementary-Middle School**

Designed to connect students with acclaimed professional artists via residencies, master classes, and workshops, the DSA Pathways is supported by 24 arts organizations, partners, colleges, and universities.

The Middle School Arts Conservatories and DSA are open to all students in Metro Detroit. Students who want to focus on acting, singing, playing instruments, creating artwork or dancing must apply and audition. Prospective applicants will be provided audition instructions.
