

School Pause for Reopening & other Updates

DPSCD Students and Families,

Please be advised that the suspension of in person learning and teaching will be extended for the week of April 19th due to continually high infection rate levels in the City. We hope to re-establish Learning Centers by April 26th. As communicated previously this week, opt in state testing will also occur the week of April 26th at schools. Please continue to check your district email box for important and frequent updates from Dr. Vitti.

Meal distribution returns **Monday, April 12, 2021** and **Thursday, April 15** from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at all school locations.

Multiple meals may be collected for students from any DPSCD school to accommodate the needs of our students. Typically, 3 breakfast/lunch meals are provided on Monday and 4 breakfast/lunch meals are provided on Thursday.

RE: Informational Notice of Self-Reported COVID-19 Case

This letter is informational only; no further action is required for you/your student at this time.

A case of coronavirus, (COVID-19) has been self-reported at Mason Academy. All close contacts identified in the initial investigation have been noticed separately. We are working closely with the relevant health department to confirm the case, identify exposures and prevent further cases. As the relevant health department completes the investigation, they may share further updates with the District, which will then be communicated to you. We will send updated directions only if guidance from the relevant health department determines modification.

The virus that causes COVID-19 is thought to spread mainly from person to person, through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. Spread is more likely when people are less than 6 feet from each other for at least 15 minutes. A person who is a close contact of someone who is infected with COVID-19 may experience COVID-19 symptoms typically within two to fourteen days after a person is exposed.

The symptoms of COVID-19 are similar in children and adults. Symptoms can include: Fever (>100.4°F), cough, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, runny or stuffy nose, loss of taste or smell, abdominal pain.

There are many things that can be done to keep our schools, homes, and communities "COVID-19 free" and protect ourselves and loved ones:

- 1. Children and adults should stay home when ill.
- 2. Washing hands often with soap and running warm water for at least 20 seconds.
- 3. If a hand washing station is not available, use hand sanitizer properly. Gels, rubs, and hand wipes work well against COVID-19 if they contain at least 60% alcohol. Throw wipes in the trash after use.
- 4. Practice Good Respiratory Etiquette (cover a cough with elbow versus hand).
- 5. Follow guidance for wearing a face covering and social distancing.

As a precaution, we will be disinfecting applicable areas of the school/Central Office. This may include spraying classrooms, hallways, locker rooms, and common areas as needed with a sanitizer, along with other methods of disinfection.

COVID-19 Screening Tool for Families

Parents and guardians, use this checklist <u>every day</u> before sending your children to school.

If you answer "YES" to one or more questions, you <u>must</u> keep your child home from school today.

Does your child have any unusual symptoms from the list below?

YES	NO	
		A fever? (Temperature greater than 100.4° F)
		A new or worsening cough?
		Headache and/or sore throat?
		Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing?
		Runny nose and/or congestion?
		Body aches and/or tiredness?
		Vomiting and/or diarrhea?
		New loss of smell or taste?



If the answer to any of the questions above is "yes", keep your child home and consult your primary care physician.

If a doctor determines that the symptoms are due to another diagnosis, or COVID-19 is ruled out, your child may return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

	Has your child had close contact with anyone who had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic test in the past 14 days?
	Has your child traveled out of the US by airplane in the last 14 days?

If the answer to either of these questions is "yes", your child must stay home to quarantine for 14 days since last contact or return to US.
