

MAKING A COLLEGE DECISION

STEP 1: HOW TO MAKE A DECISION

Co	implete the steps below to help guide you toward making a college decision.
	Apply to schools of choice and acquire acceptance letters. (Share copies w/ counselor)
	Complete FAFSA and ensure all schools of choice are listed in your application.
	Apply for scholarships. (institutional, local, private etc.)
	Log in to student portal for each school you have been admitted to.
	 Make it a habit to log in each portal once a week for reminders or document request.
	Submit verification documents (if applicable) to ensure you receive an award letter.
	 Log in to student portal or call financial aid office to check for outstanding documents.
	Confirm you have received an award letter for each school you are considering.
	 Revisit previous step if you have not received an award letter.
	With support of parent/guardian/trusted adult, compare award letters and determine which is the best choice for you and your family's financial needs.
	Look at graduation rates and retention rates to help in decision making process.
	Look at other important factors for best fit such as majors, sports, clubs, Greek life etc.
	Visit Campus or take virtual campus tour to get a feel for the place you will call home.
	Think it over . Take your time and consider your thoughts and feelings.
S	TEP 2: ONCE YOU MAKE A DECISION
Co	implete the steps below to make your decision official with the institution.
	Accept your admissions offer via student portal or directions listed in acceptance letter.
	Accept financial aid offer via student portal or directions listed in award letter.
	 Loan acceptances may require signing Master Promissory Note (MPN).
	Decline other admissions offers by sending brief email/letter to turn down offer.
	Pay enrollment deposit (if applicable) by schools designated deadline (typically May 1).Contact admissions office for options to have deposit waived or deferred.
П	Register for freshman orientation. (Tell your counselor/adviser your orientation date)
	Complete a housing application. (usually on a first come, first serve basis)
	Complete Medical forms such as insurance forms, shot records and emergency contact.
	Inform HS counselor/adviser of your final decision.
	Take any required assessment test.

	Complete Detroit Promise ATR form sent via email if you're a scholarship recipient.
	Send final HS Transcript with graduation date listed.

Check campus website for incoming freshman checklist.
Attend freshman orientation.
Register for classes.
Investigate textbook cost and purchasing options.
 You can buy new, buy used or rent books.
Confirm housing placement.
Connect with future roommates (if applicable).
Go shopping for dorm room items and school supplies.
Research Professors if possible, on sites like Rate My Professors.
Connect with college on social media.
Move in your dorm and get comfortable in your new space.
• Attend activities and events hosted by your residence hall. It's a great way to start meeting new people and making new friends.
