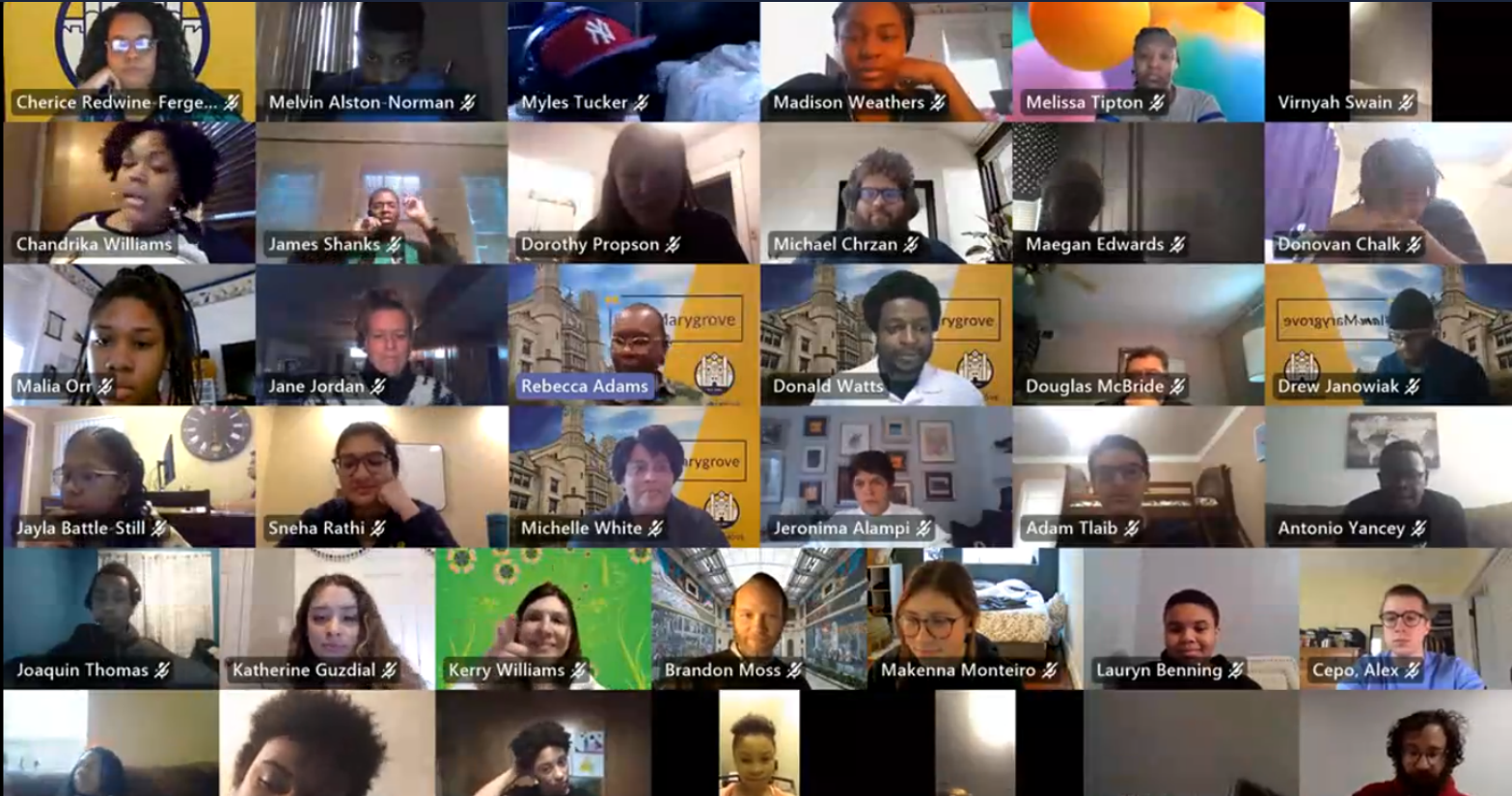

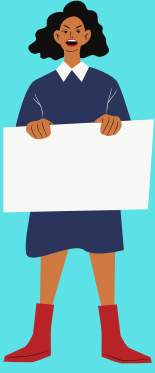

The focus of the Expect Respect campaign for the month of January is Citizenship

The social justice and engineering focus enables students to identify and solve complex problems, actively participating in the creation of a more just and equitable future. Every graduate will be prepared to pursue their passions and succeed in any personal and professional endeavors.”
- The School at Marygrove’s mission statement exemplifies our institutions commitment to developing the types of citizens that are able and willing to challenge the status quo and speak truth to power for the benefit, and betterment of circumstances, for all members of society. A TSM student knows that injustice anywhere is an injustice everywhere and that they have a social responsibility to be citizens of the world.

How will we be practicing citizenship this month?

- The School at Marygrove will create a digital “**Citizenship Collage**”. Students, please submit images, words, and phrases of what citizenship means to you via email (Antonio.Yancey@detroitk12.org) or Microsoft Teams message to Mr. Yancey. All submissions will be consolidated into multiple virtual bulletin boards that we will use in both virtual and physical spaces.
- The School at Marygrove is planning a “**Community Helpers Day**” where an elected official, police officer, firefighter, veteran, etc. visits the school to speak to students. These individuals will share their personal stories and discuss the importance of being a good citizen.
- The School at Marygrove’s **Student Council** is the most influential student organization at The School at Marygrove. In two years, the student council has organized multiple food and clothing drives. Most recently the student council advocated for and planned The School at Marygrove’s hit Wellness Symposium. Members of the student council will prepare a short video or written statement of what citizenship means to them and how they, as members of the student council, have been able to participate in school decisions and practice their citizenship this year.

UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN

Wolverine Pathways is a free, year-round program that partners with the families, schools, and communities of Detroit, Ypsilanti, and Southfield. This partnership provides learning experiences that will help students succeed in school, college, and future careers.

All Wolverine Pathways scholars who successfully complete their program, apply to the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor or Dearborn, and are admitted will receive a full, four-year tuition scholarship.

The Wolverine Pathways application is open now through February 5, 2021 for the Fall 2021 entering cohort. The application will be open for current 6th and current 8th grade students who live within the city of Detroit, Southfield public school district boundaries, or Ypsilanti public school district boundaries.

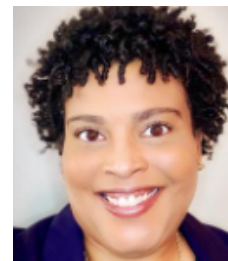
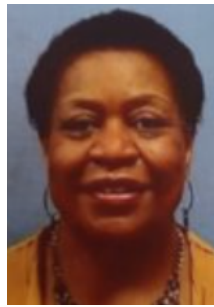

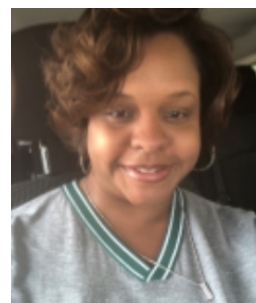
