



WHAT IS MONTESSORI?

Montessori is an educational approach that emphasizes self-directed activity, hands-on learning, and collaborative play. It was developed by Dr. Maria Montessori, an Italian physician and educator, in the early 20th century.

Key Principles of Montessori Education:

- Child-Centered Learning: Students are encouraged to choose their own activities and work at their own pace. The role of the teacher, or "guide," is to facilitate and support rather than direct learning.
- Prepared Environment: Classrooms are designed to be inviting and organized, with materials and resources that are accessible to children and encourage exploration and independence.
- Hands-On Learning: Emphasis is placed on concrete, sensory experiences rather than abstract instruction. Montessori materials are designed to be tactile and engage multiple senses.
- Mixed-Age Groups: Classrooms typically include children of varying ages, fostering peer learning and collaboration. Older children often help younger ones, reinforcing their own knowledge and skills.

Origins of Montessori Education:

Early Beginnings: Maria Montessori began her work with children in the early 1900s, initially focusing on children with developmental disabilities. Her innovative methods led to remarkable improvements in their abilities and behaviors.

Casa dei Bambini: In 1907, Montessori opened the first "Casa dei Bambini" (Children's House) in Rome. This was a school for children from impoverished backgrounds, and it was here that she implemented her educational approach on a broader scale.

Global Spread: Montessori's methods quickly gained recognition and spread internationally. The Montessori approach was adapted and implemented in various countries, and Montessori schools continue to thrive worldwide. Montessori education is respected for its emphasis on developing a child's independence, respect for others, and a lifelong love of learning.





7:45 am: Students enter at Door 1 on Canfield St. **7:50 am:** Breakfast is served in the cafeteria.


Lunch: Time varies by class and is served in the cafeteria. **3:10 pm:** School ends. Pickup is at Door 1 from 3:10-3:20 pm

Please follow the map's guidelines to maintain traffic flow and ensure the safety of all students during school hours.








PRIMARY PICK-UP & DROP OFF
