Semester 1 Testing

Academic Approach provides customized assessment and reporting services geared toward raising student achievement on the SAT. These practice assessments produce valuable data for both students and teachers as they look to maximize classroom time building the core skills evaluated on official tests. Academic Approach will be administered for a second time to all 9 -11 graders from January 19th -22nd. Seniors will not be tested. The district science and social studies benchmarks will be administered through Performance Matters. Eleventh graders will take Performance Matters between January 6th – 15th.

Final exams are coming, how do I prepare in the virtual world? Here are some tips that may help. **Create a routine.**

~Determine the topics that will be covered and make a study timetable.

Study/review in chunks. Try 25 minutes on and take 5 minutes off. This will help with study fatigue and feeling overwhelmed.
Learn concepts-not just words.
Learn concepts and ideas, do not just memorize text. Begin reviewing notes to *learn*. If open book, the point is to know how to apply the concepts, not what you can remember.

~Revise your notes. Make summary sheets with ideas, quotes and analysis. Based on the amount of time you have, prioritize.

Tackle exam anxieties.

~Feeling anxious is okay. Find ways to minimize the stress. Create an exam space that is not your bed. Practice testing in the environment. Finally, ensure that your connection, device and platform are working well in advance of the exam.
