
Principal Stroughter's Corner

Renaissance Safety & Security Plan

The safety and security of our community is our number one goal. With that there are several things that we do to ensure the building is always safe. Here are a few things students and parents can do to assist.

- Wear Renaissance Dress Code daily.
 - Burgundy or Khaki bottoms (skirts and shorts must be 2 inches above the knee
 - Burgundy or White collared shirt, burgundy or white Renaissance shirt, burgundy or white sweater, sweatshirt, outer layer
 - FRIDAY ONLY- Spirit Day: BLUE jeans and a Renaissance shirt or burgundy or white shirt
 - STUDENT IDS MUST BE WORN
- Food cannot be delivered to the school using Door Dash, Uber Eats, etc.
- Students and parents should only enter and exit through door number 1 (main door). All other doors should not be touched or propped open.
- See something, say something.
- Have a pass while in the hallway outside of hall passing time.
- Pay attention to the adult and take all drills seriously. We will
 practice drills at least 10 times throughout the year.

Safety Drills

The state requires all public school to practice drills every year. There are 3 types of drills: fire, tornado, and lockdown. It is imperative that students take all drills seriously, are aware of where they are in the building to know what to do and where to go and to listen to instructions from the adults. This year we will also include an evacuation drill in which we will leave the campus.

During all drills students should:

- Listen to instructions
- Remain quiet
- Move quickly and swiftly to the safety location
- Stay at the location in an orderly fashion
- Be sure they get counted in attendance
- Stay off cell phones
