What is Montessori?

The Montessori Method was developed by Dr. Maria Montessori, an Italian doctor and educator. The Montessori method focuses on student independence through peer collaboration using hands on learning from a concrete to abstract perspective. The guide offers age-appropriate instructional activities to guide the process.


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VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITES START HERE.

Breakfast and Lunch are served daily

Primary students eat breakfast in their class.

Lower/Upper Elementary students are welcome to eat breakfast in the cafeteria beginning at 7:50 a.m.

If your student has specific dietary needs or allergies, please let administration know so we can provide the proper documentation to our cafeteria staff.

Lunch is provided. However, students are welcome to bring their lunch to school each day. Edmonson is a **nut free and shellfish free** healthy living school. Please check ingredients to ensure these products are not packed in lunches.



Students should bring the following items:

- Gym shoes- Students will have physical education. Students are not able to participate with boots on as it harms the gym floors nor croc style as it is a safety hazard.
- 2. Quiet shoes (recommended) Students will be able to change into quiet shoes to minimize the germs that enter our environment.
- 3. Primary Students (PreK/K) a full set of extra change of clothing for accidents. (pants, shirt, undergarments, socks)
- 4. Primary Students (PreK) Crib sheet and blanket for naps. (Optional) NO STUFF ANIMALS.
- 5. Headphones (optional) students will still have to complete i-Ready and headphones will assist them in concentration. (K-8)
- 6. Water bottle (optional)- The stations are equipped with water bottle filling stations that allow students to fill water bottles in order to hydrate throughout the day.
