

Learning Centers

Open for Business!!!!!

Learning Centers in all DPSCD Schools will be open beginning Wednesday, February 24, 2021.

Mason Academy's Learning Centers will be open from 8:30am until 3:40pm beginning Wednesday, February 24, 2021 and will remain open every week day there after until



further notice. There are differences between the Learning Center and Face 2 Face instruction. In the Learning Centers, students will be socially distanced and will received support with technology from our instructional support staff. <u>They will receive their instruction from their teachers virtually.</u>

In Face 2 Face instruction, students will be socially distanced but receive instruction and instructional support from a teacher that will be in the room with them throughout the day. We do not have a date when Face 2 Face instruction will begin. When we are given a date, we will share it with you.

Here are our expectations for Learning Center Participation:

- Students must wear a mask over their nose and mouth at all times.
- Students must wear their school uniform daily.
- All students will enter the building through Door 4 between 8:15am & 8:45am. This will take time because students must go through COVID-19 Screening Protocols individually.
- Walkers and students picked up by their parents will dismiss from the building out Door 3 at 3:35pm.
- Bus Riders must follow all COVID-19 protocols while on the bus as if they were still in the building. Failure to follow these expectations may result in removal from the bus.
- Parents must make an appointment to enter the building. Please call 313-866-3700 or text 313-706-4632 to schedule your appointment.
- All students that have received their books for Quarter 3 and their loaner laptop must bring their books, loaner laptop and power cord with them daily. Students that have received Loaner Laptops will not receive another laptop for use in the building.
- All persons in the building must maintain 6 foot social distance at all times and in all areas of the building.
- All students will participate in orientation upon return to the learning centers. All students are expected to follow the guidelines of the Code of Conduct. <u>Failure to follow expectations established during the</u> <u>orientation may result in removal from the learning center.</u>
- Learning Center hours are 8:30am to 3:40pm. Students must be picked up on time to allow our custodial staff to clean and sanitize the building.

COVID-19 Screening Tool for Families

Parents and guardians, use this checklist every day before sending your children to school.

If you answer "YES" to one or more questions, you <u>must</u> keep your child home from school today.

Does your child have any unusual symptoms from the list below?

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	A fever? (Temperature greater than 100.4°
	A new or worsening cough?
	Headache and/or sore throat?
	Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing?
	Runny nose and/or congestion?
	Body aches and/or tiredness?
	Vomiting and/or diarrhea?

New loss of smell or taste?



If the answer to any of the questions above is "yes"; keep your child home and consult your primary care physician. If a doctor determines that the symptoms are due to another diagnosis, or COVID-19 is ruled out, your child may return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

Has your child had close contact with anyone who had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic test in the past 14 days?

Has your child traveled out of the US by airplane in the last 14 days?

If the answer to either of these questions is "yes", your child must stay home to quarantine for 14 days since last contact or return to US.


