What is the "Swing Space" Plan

Q: Why is the school moving to the former CMA building at 14771 Mansfield Street?

A: Due to insufficient space to accommodate the new building construction while the current building is in operation, the Paul Robeson Malcolm X program is relocating to prevent disruption on site due to construction.

Duration

Q: For how long will students be housed at the former CMA building at 14771 Mansfield Street?

A: Classes will be held at the 14771 Mansfield campus until construction of the new Paul Robeson Malcolm X building is completed in 2027. Students are scheduled to return to the new building in August, 2027.

Bell Schedule

Q: Will the bell schedule remain the same?

A: The recommended Bell Schedule is 8:45am – 3:55pm to allow for shuttle transportation from the current site.

Transportation

Q: Will transportation be provided to the former CMA building at 14771 Mansfield Street?

A: Yellow bus transportation will be offered to students as listed below:

Corner Stops: Yellow bus service will continue for PRMX students currently receiving corner stop service. PRMX students will be transported to the Mansfield location from their current corner stop in the PRMX boundary.

Shuttle: Shuttle bus service will be provided from the current PRMX building to the Mansfield location. Students may begin boarding yellow bus shuttles at 8:00 a.m. Shuttles will departure at approximately 8:15 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. An 8:45 a.m. shuttle will be offered for those who may miss the earlier departure times.

Door Stop: Pre-k students will be assigned to Bethune Elementary/Middle School. Door stop transportation will be offered from the home of each incoming pre-k student to Bethune

Q: Will transportation be offered for parents to the Mansfield campus?

A: A shuttle from the current site to the swing space site will be provided to parents once a week.

Q: What happens if a student becomes ill during the school day and the parent who lives in the current PRMX boundary does not have transportation?

A: Arrangements will be made by the school's administration to provide transportation service for parents who currently walk to the current PRMX campus as needed on a case by case basis.

Q: How will transportation be provided for my family with multi-age children?

A: The District will work with parents with multi-age children (students with a rising Pre-K sibling) on an individual basis with enrollment at Bethune Elementary/Middle School and address transportation needs. The siblings will be placed in PRMX's kindergarten the following school year.

Pre-K

Q: Is Pre-K included in the school program at the former CMA building at 14771 Mansfield Street?

A: No, due to state licensing requirements, it is cost prohibitive to include space for PreK at the temporary location. All funding is allocated for the new building.

Q: Where will Paul Robeson Malcolm X Pre-K students go to school?

A: Pre-K students will be assigned to Bethune Elementary/Middle School. Door stop transportation will be offered from the home of each incoming Pre-K student to Bethune.

Q: When Pre-K students progress to Kindergarten, will they attend Paul Robeson Malcolm X at the temporary location?

A: Yes, Pre-K student that progress to Kindergarten will attend Paul Robeson Malcolm X the following school year at the temporary location.

School Nutrition

Q: How will children in the neighborhood participate in the Meet Up to Eat Up program over the summer?

A: The Meet Up to Eat Up program only participates at school buildings that are open during the summer for programs. Paul Robeson Malcolm X has not previously participated in this program. However, Schulze is the nearest Meet Up to Eat Up site.

Q: Will menu items change at the temporary location?

A: No, the District will continue to provide free breakfast, lunch, and a hot supper for students that participate in after-school programs.
